REGISTRATION

Non-Gannon Students who are in good academic standing at their current colleges or universities are welcome to attend Summer Sessions. They need to submit written approval for course enrollment from their home college or university and complete the Gannon University application and registration form.

Currently Enrolled Gannon Students are encouraged to register on GUXpress through Gannon's home page or go directly to **my.gannon.edu**. Select 'GUXpress,' then 'GUXpress for Student,' then 'Register for Sections.' Your login is your network ID.

Use GUXpress to 'Search for Classes'. You cannot register on GUXpress for courses requiring written permission. This includes courses that require instructor permission or if you have written permission to register for a closed course. Register for all other courses on GUXpress then bring the written permission to the Registrar's Office.

Students who choose not to registrar on GUXpress can come to the Registrar's Office to register. You should fill out the registration form with your choice of courses and have it signed by your advisor. The Registrar's Office cannot process registrations without the advisor's signature on the registration form.

Course Load for undergraduate students should be no more than two courses (generally 6 credits) for each session.

Course Changes – Adds and/or Drops

Schedules can be changed on GUXpress or in the Registrar's Office. Contact your advisor for GUXpress approval. Change of Schedule forms are available in the Registrar's Office or in the Center for Adult Learning for students who prefer to change a schedule in person. An advisor's signature is required on the form.

Withdrawal Grades – Students can drop a course and receive a withdrawal (X) grade before 60% of the course is complete. When a student stops attending a course and does not properly withdraw, the student may be subject to receiving a grade of 'F' for the course.

The last day to withdraw from a:

2 week 'A' session course is May 14.

5 week 'B' session course is June 11.

5 week 'C' session course is July 16.

Contact the Registrar's Office for withdrawal dates of courses with different starting or ending dates.

Dining Facilities

Doc's Landing located in the Waldron Center will be open during the Summer Session Monday thru Friday, 7:15 a.m. - 2:00 p.m.

Library facilities and services are available to students during the summer. Check with the library for hours of service. Library services include computer work stations and wireless laptops, which may be borrowed for use in the building, as well as a variety of study spaces.

Online Courses, in the Summer Session, are available to all students with advisor approval. Current Gannon students can register on GUXpress for summer ONLINE courses. No special permission is required. ONLINE COURSES, which have been developed for independent study, are demanding and require a strong commitment to stay on schedule for successful completion.

Summer On-Campus Housing is limited for students enrolled in summer courses until the end of their lease, July 20.

If a student is enrolled in a course that has a published date that exceeds the lease date of July 20 they may be able to extend it another week or until the class ends. There may be an additional charge for this option. For approval to do so, students need to submit a letter to the Student Living Office with proof that they are enrolled in a class that exceeds the lease date. This is not guaranteed and depends on availability.

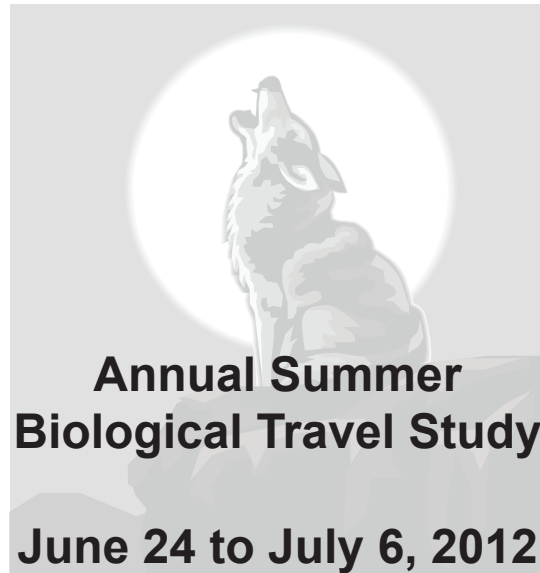
ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE PROGRAM

Gannon University anticipates offering the following English as a Second Language (ESL) courses. While these non-credit courses are offered as Continuing Education Units and required as a condition of admission to the University, they are not applicable toward the degree requirements of our academic programs.

Open to all majors

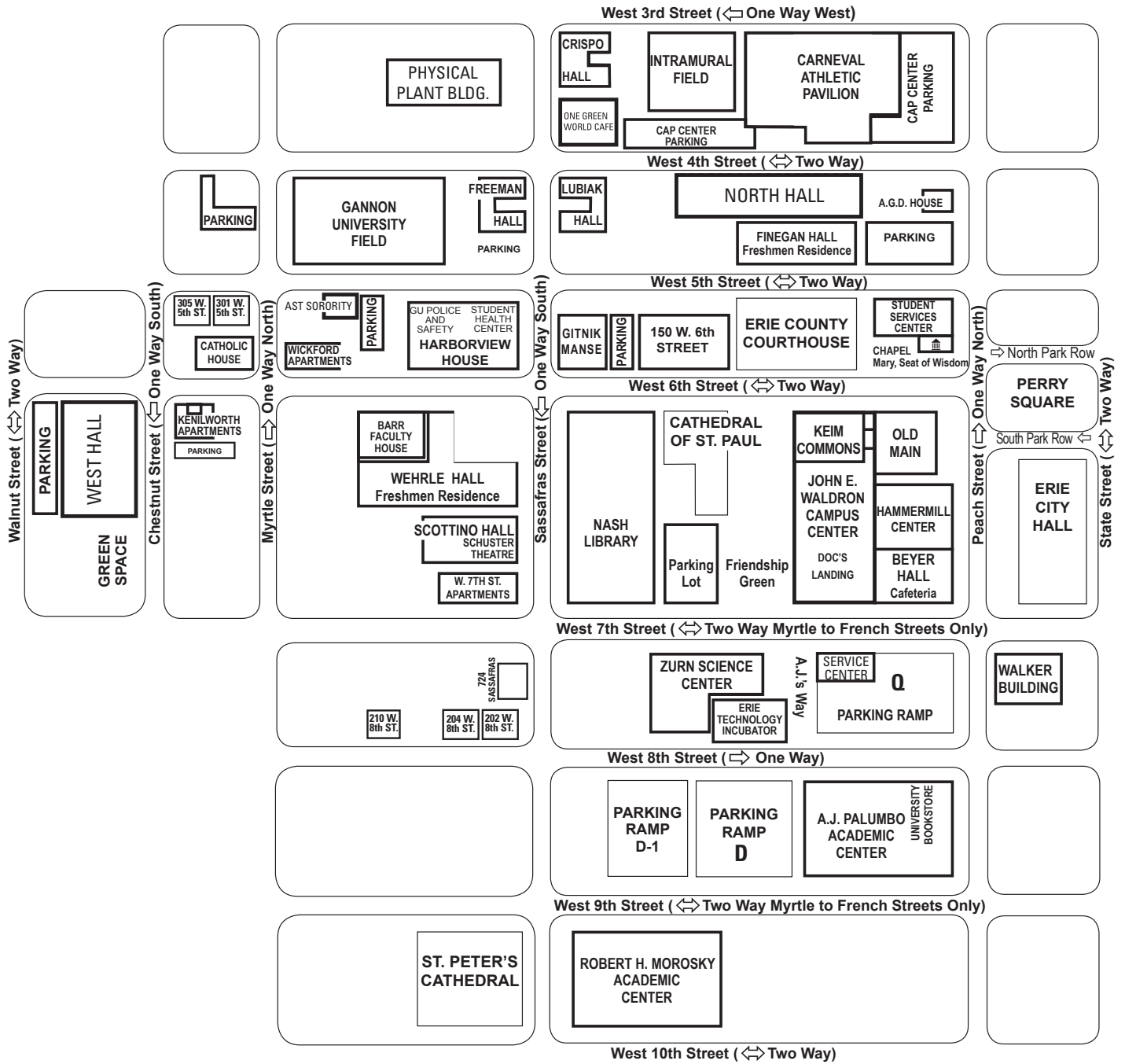
This course will examine many aspects of Yellowstone National Park. Topics to be covered include grizzly bears, wolf reintroduction, impact of fires, geysers and past volcanic activity, geological history including earthquakes and the herbivores of the park (bison, moose, antelope and elk). One day will also be spent at the Museum of the Rockies in Bozeman reviewing their dinosaur exhibit and getting a behind-the-scenes tour. Professors David J. Gustafson and Steven J. Ropski will conduct the class.

The program will be joined by experts in each area who will spend time with the class. The tentative schedule includes Rick McIntyre, Park Naturalist/Ranger (grizzlies/fires); Doug Smith, Resident Yellowstone Park Naturalist/Researcher (Wolf Reintroduction Program); and Maury Irvine, Resident Paleontologist, Museum of the Rockies.

Cost of \$1,995.00 includes round trip air fare from Erie, textbooks, handouts, lodging, some meals, entrance fees, and transportation in the park. (Cost for credits not included.)
