

Mentoring Opportunity with the Erie School District

Gannon University has entered into a partnership with the Erie School District where college students will provide mentoring to ninth grade students at Strong Vincent High School beginning in the Spring of 2008.

Interested students from any major are encouraged to apply. As a university mentor, you will work with small groups of students on a quarterly basis to provide academic advising sessions to review student grades, to discuss concerns and strategies for success, and to encourage students to enroll in a college-prep curriculum. Mentors will work under the direction of a Gannon Faculty Coordinator and attend training workshops that will focus on advising, tutoring, and career counseling skills. Mentors will also attend monthly meetings with the Program Coordinator to discuss progress.

Students who are capable of tutoring high school students in math, science, technology, and writing will be given preference. Preference will also be given to juniors and seniors. Mentors will earn \$13.00 per hour for their services.
