The Gannon Press Copy Center is now offering COPIES-WHILE-U-WAIT. Effective Monday, Feb. 7, the service will be available daily from 7:30 to 9:30 a.m.

There are, however, some guidelines of which users of this service should be aware: ♦Up to a total of 500 impressions per job (example: 10 pp. @ 50 each = 500 impressions, collated and stapled, 10 minute turnaround); ♦Originals should be clean and copy-ready (all staples removed, etc.); ♦Black ink only (accent color available within 24-hour turnaround guidelines); ♦Copyright material must be accompanied by written permission from the publisher; ♦Folding available within four-hour turnaround.
