Golden Harvest Food Drive set

Gannon's Office of Students Living will hold its 24th annual Golden Harvest Food Drive Nov. 4. Students will go door-to-door from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. to collect donations of non-perishable food items.

The collection will benefit the Second Harvest Food Bank of Northwest Pennsylvania. Volunteers will canvass neighborhoods throughout Erie and Millcreek, wearing "Golden Harvest" badges as identification.

Items also may be dropped off at the West Erie Plaza, located on Pittsburgh Avenue between Eighth and 12th streets; St. George Catholic Church, 5145 Peach St.; Ridgefield Elementary School, 3227 Highland Ave.; and the Second Harvest Food Bank, 17th and Ash streets.

Erin Cray of McKeesport, a senior education major, attended the University College of Northampton, located north of London. She also traveled to Warwick Castle, Cambridge University, Paris, Holland and Ireland.

Chrysanthi Diakou of Athens, Greece, a junior international business major, spent time in Paris. Diakou is minoring in French. The trip included study at the Sorbonne and visits to museums, the Eiffel Tower and Opera of Bastille.

Josephine Dickinson of DuBois, a junior psychology major, studied in Spain. Dickinson is pursuing a double minor in Spanish and English. She studied Spanish and global communications in Spanish at the Universidad de Salamanca. She also traveled to Madrid, Segovia and Portugal. Dickinson's trip was supported by a Study Abroad Grant from Gannon's College of Humanities, Business and Education.

Darlene Peterson of Erie, a junior with a dual major in foreign languages and business administration, studied at the Sorbonne in Paris. At Gannon, Peterson is a full-time adult student who graduated in 1979 from General McLane High School. Peterson's trip represented her second study abroad experience. She studied in France in summer 1999 as well.

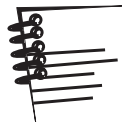
