Risk management lecture Jan. 25

Gannon will continue its new Risk Manager-in-residence Program Jan. 25 with a focus on corporate risk management strategies. Sandra L. Mitchell, manager of corporate insurance for the Gillette Corp., Boston, will present "Managing Corporate Risk: Domestic and Global Strategies."

The session is the second installment in the Gannon workshop series, which focuses on strategic planning and risk analysis. The morning-long seminar is geared toward students and practicing professionals in the risk management and insurance industries.

Mitchell will provide an overview of risk management at Gillette, with discussion focusing on long term strategy, risk retention vs. transfer, and internal and external teams. She also will discuss broker and agent use, focusing on the global representation process of choosing and evaluating a broker and the evolving roles of brokers. Finally, Mitchell will offer ways to better serve clients, with topics including the availability of resources currently affecting global markets, liability issues, and property protection.

The seminar will be from 8 to 11:45 a.m. in the Yehl Alumni Room of the Waldron Campus Center. Cost of the program is \$20 per person or \$38 per person for continuing education credits. Deadline for reservations is Jan. 22. To register, call ext. 7566.

Faculty Research applications available

The Faculty Research Committee announces the availability of applications for the 2000-01 Faculty Research Grants.

Grants are available to all full-time Gannon faculty and professional library staff. Grants usually range from \$500 to \$4,000 and may be used to cover research project costs such as equipment, travel, assistants (minimum wage or greater if justified,) and fees. The project should be completed within two years and must be research-oriented. The grants are for faculty research only.

Preference is given to first-time applicants. Previous recipients must have progress reports for earlier projects on file with the committee.
