Faculty achievements noted

Sharon Crisman, Ph.D., assistant professor of education, recently participated in the Keystone State Reading Conference at Seven Springs Mountain Resort. Crisman, together with representatives of the Fairview School District, presented a panel on school-wide summer reading themes encouraging recreational reading. The presentation also included ways to encourage parental involvement, reading incentives, and opportunity to combine additional district entities and community resources.

Anmarie George, a professor of music, had an article published in the September 2000 edition of *Catholic Music Educator*, the quarterly newsletter of the Music Educators Division of the National Association of Pastoral Musicians. George's article, "Give Your Choir and Music Class a Fall Overhaul," discussed ways to improve the performances of school and church choirs.

Very Rev. Joseph C. Gregorek, Ph.D., professor of biology, recently was appointed chairperson of the Primary Care Research Network, a newly formed committee of the Pennsylvania Health Education Center at the Pennsylvania State University College of Medicine in Hershey. Supported by state and federal grants, the network performs research for all medical schools in the state. Fr. Gregorek also for four years has been an adjunct clinical associate professor of family and community medicine at the Pennsylvania State University College of Medicine.

Candace Jaruszewicz, instructor of education, recently successfully defended her dissertation for a doctorate in curriculum and instruction at Kent State University. Her study, "Exploring Teachers' Critical Incidents: It's Easy if You Just Look at It," explored and examined teachers' perceptions about critical incidents – individual experiences with students that they considered to be defining moments. The results of the research suggested that examining teachers' critical incidents could be potentially useful for professional development.

Philip Kelly, D.A., professor of English, recently had an article published for the second time. "The Bean Trees: A New Classroom Classic," first published in *The English Journal*, December 1997, has been reprinted in a new book, *Contemporary Literary Criticism*, (Gale Group, 2000) by Tim White and Jeff Hunter.

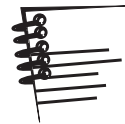

Conserving energy

Campus Services has initiated an energy conservation pilot program that is designed to replace certain inefficient lighting fixtures and equipment with those that are more efficient, and to use the utility savings to fund the project. This pilot program seeks to replace lighting in many areas in Palumbo, Beyer and Hammermill. It also will involve replacing the cafeteria dishwasher, deep fryers and air conditioner. The work is being coordinated by NORESKO, a company that specializes in performance contracts, and should take place during the next several months.
