Whad'Ya Know, Wright?

Tune in your radios to WQLN this Saturday, Feb. 17, to hear one of Gannon's own on a national radio show!

Bruce Morton Wright, the leader of Gannon University's Erie Chamber Orchestra, will be among the featured guests on *Michael Feldman's Whad'Ya Know*. The popular Wisconsin Public Radio comedy/interview/quiz program will be broadcast live from Erie this weekend.

The show, heard each week on Erie's WQLN 91.3 FM, is being broadcast live from the Warner Theatre Saturday from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. The show airs on more than 300 Public Radio International affiliates across the United States and has a measured weekly audience of 1.4 million listeners, according to producers.

Wright, director and conductor of the orchestra, will take with him a woodwind quartet from the orchestra.

Bishop to deliver Vatican II talk

Erie Bishop Donald W. Trautman will speak at Gannon Feb. 19 on Vatican II. Trautman will deliver a speech titled "The Challenge of Vatican II: Fulfilled and Unfulfilled." The talk originally was scheduled in December but was postponed.

Sponsored by the Theology Department, the talk commemorates the 35th anniversary of the closing of the Second Vatican Council, known as Vatican II. The 1962-65 Second Vatican Council's pronouncements have shaped the modern church.

Trautman, chair of Gannon's Board of Trustees, studied in graduate school under theologian Kurt Rahner and liturgist Josef Jungmann, whose work provided much of the intellectual basis for Vatican II. Trautman was a junior staff member at Vatican II and on the floor during most of the deliberations.

Vatican II introduced liturgical changes that were controversial at the time but have since been largely accepted. These include permitting Mass in the language of the people and granting a greater role to lay people.

The free speech will begin at 7 p.m. in Zurn 104.

OT Program undertaking study

Students and faculty in the Occupational Therapy Program are conducting a research study to determine if an education and exercise program can reduce the fear of falling in the elderly, and participants are being sought.

The educational portion of the research will take place over a five-week period. It will require individuals to fill out questionnaires about their fear of falling and daily activities. Some of the individuals will be provided with education and line dance exercise for five weeks, while others will receive initial assessment and follow-up to compare date results. The project may allow the researchers to determine if an exercise and educational program reduces the fear of falling.
