Board approves tuition, salaries

Gannon's Board of Trustees recently approved tuition and salary measures for 2001-02.

The Board agreed to a six percent tuition increase. Full-time students in Business, Humanities, Education and Sciences will pay \$7,245 per semester, while full-time students enrolled in Engineering or Health Sciences will pay \$7,690 per semester.

The Board approved a four percent dual-faceted compensation package. Of that percentage, three percent will be allocated for salary increases based on performance; a pool of .8 percent will be allocated primarily to adjust individuals with salaries below 80 percent of market survey averages, awarded based on performance; and a .2 percent pool will be allocated to adjust individuals who currently are paid below \$7 an hour. The preliminary budget plan anticipates that this increase will be delayed for at least three months pending a budget review in the fall.

APB lecture features 'Dating Doctor'

"The Dating Doctor" will discuss relationships March 14 as Gannon continues its 2000-01 Distinguished Speaker Series.

David Coleman, known as The Dating Doctor, will present a talk on "The Cure for the Common Relationship." His presentation will include topics such as who controls relationships and why; what all men and women want; the five stages of a relationship; and understanding the dangers of the drugs GHB and Ecstasy.

Through his many lectures, more than one million people at more than 1,700 college campuses, singles' organizations, churches and marriage encounter groups nationwide have heard Coleman's presentations. Coleman's Creative Dating program has won national and international acclaim.

His recent book release, *Date Smart!*, has been ranked in the top 10 percent of all books selling on Amazon.com since its release in February 2000.

The talk will begin at 7:30 p.m. March 14 in Zurn 104. Sponsored by the student-run Activities Programming Board, the event is free and open to the public.

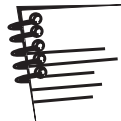
