### Summer School of Excellence set

Gannon is seeking applications for its Regional Summer School of Excellence in July.

The program, set for July 9-13 and 16-20, offers high school students two weeks of intensive laboratory and field site study in the life sciences. Outstanding sophomore and junior students in Erie, Crawford and Warren counties are eligible to apply.

Covering the theme of "Investigating and Research Environmental Health Problems," the summer school is under the direction of Stanley Zagorski, retired dean of Gannon's College of Science and Engineering. Faculty members are the Rev. Joseph Gregorek, professor of biology, and Michael Bucholtz, Ph.D., chair of the Chemistry Department.

The summer school will introduce students to standard methods used in researching environmental health problems and help them to relate technology, engineering, chemistry and biological science and how each plays a vital role in understanding environmental issues, Zagorski said.

Topics covered will include ecological sampling techniques, water chemistry, lake pollution, population dynamics, air pollution, acid rains and eutrophication. The program will include research on Presque Isle Bay and Lake Erie aboard Gannon's research vessel, the *Environaut*.

The program is free and lunches are provided. Students must provide their own transportation to and from the university each day, with class running from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

The Regional Summer School of Excellence is sponsored by the Pennsylvania Governor's School of Excellence, the Pennsylvania Department of Education Office of Environment and Ecology, the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection, Gannon University, and the Northwest Tri-County Intermediate Unit.

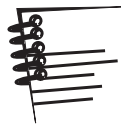
