GU hosts workshop to teach chemistry teachers

Gannon's Science in Motion program is hosting a week-long workshop June 25-29 to educate Erie County chemistry teachers on the use of advanced instrumentation and experimentation.

Topics will encompass both chemistry and environmental chemistry applications in the areas of microscale analysis, accuracy and precision, chromatography, electrophoresis, pH, and spectroscopy.

The workshop will include a field trip Thursday aboard the *Environaut*, Gannon's floating laboratory, to gather data, followed by classroom analysis. In addition, HyperChem Lite, a molecular modeling and simulation program, will be taught.

Participants will learn to use microscale techniques, handle analytical balances and pipettes, operate a gas chromatograph and a high performance liquid chromatograph, separate proteins with electrophoresis, and analyze pH with pH meters.

By participating in this workshop, the chemistry teachers will observe, study and master many of the requirements of the Pennsylvania Academic Standards and then be able to incorporate the workshop instrumentation into their high school curriculum.
