Business students earn scholarships from MCI

Two students in Gannon University's Dahlkemper School of Business Administration have been named William G. McGowan Scholars through a program named in memory of the founder of MCI Communications.

Edward Kocis of Sharpsville, a senior majoring in accounting and finance, and John Yurisinec of Irwin, a graduate student pursuing a master of business administration degree, have been awarded full tuition for the 2001-02 academic year under the McGowan Scholars Program. Yurisinec earned his bachelor's degree in marketing from Gannon this spring.

The scholarships are being funded by a grant from the William G. McGowan Charitable Fund of Washington, D.C. The fund is named for the founder and chairman of MCI Communications Corp.

The national grant program recognizes the contributions of William McGowan to the world of business. The awards are patterned after the early experience McGowan had at Harvard University, where he was able to complete his master's degree in business administration only through the assistance of scholarships.

The McGowan Scholars Program benefits outstanding students studying business, and selection is based on grade point average, a written essay, and other criteria such as leadership qualities, character, and community involvement.

Engineering hosts summer camp

The School of Engineering and Computer Science hosted several regional high school students July 15-21 for the Quality Engineering Design Summer Camp.

The Quality Engineering Design Summer Camp is designed to provide high school juniors and seniors with an introduction to the engineering field and teach them the engineering design process, how to work effectively in design teams, how to achieve high quality design standards, and how to use modern software tools. Students participated in experiments in measurement, design, problem solving, and building electronics and robotics projects.

Activities included a robotics contest and a design competition where students engaged in modeling and constructing a scaled Medieval trebuchet, a type of catapult.

The camp was sponsored by Gannon University's School of Engineering and Computer Science, the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers, the American Society of Mechanical Engineers, and the Erie Engineers Society Council.
