## GoFish! sculptures go to market; 'Offishial' book to make debut

Fish fans can dress to the gills and bring some bait to the GoFish! Fish Market Oct. 12 to bid on their favorite fish.

Some 26 fish sculptures from Erie's GoFish! public art exhibit will be auctioned to the highest bidder to raise funds for the Gannon University Scholarship Fund and the Erie Public Art Fund, the latter of which is a new fund being established through GoFish! proceeds.

Kicked off in May, GoFish! features 93 fiberglass fish — standing some 6 feet tall — landing throughout the streets of downtown Erie. Offered in vertical or horizontal form, each whimsical sculpture was painted or otherwise embellished by talented artists from the Erie area. The public art exhibit — the first of this magnitude for Erie — has boosted tourism and brought local residents downtown to tour the streets with their families and cameras in tow.

A special feature of the evening will be the premier of *GoFish!: The Offishial Tale*, a keepsake coffee table book written, photographed, designed and published by members of the Fish Commish. Full of photographs, the book highlights the beauty and whimsy of the GoFish! artists' work, tells stories behind some of the fish, and chronicles the project from its beginnings.
