Admissions Process

We recommend that you submit your application early in your senior year. Any applications received late in the senior year will be evaluated on a space-available basis.

Candidates for admission must be graduates of an approved secondary school or must have completed the GED with a score of 660 (minimum of 165 in each section). Your academic course selection, grades, rank in class, guidance counselor recommendation and SAT or ACT scores will be carefully reviewed. Your high school curriculum must include 16 academic units. Distribution of units varies based on chosen major. All students must have four units of English. The remainder of units are to be comprised of Social Sciences, Foreign Language, Mathematics and Science.

High school students should submit the following:

- Gannon University Admissions Application (pages 5-6) or Online Application (www.gannon.edu/apply)
- An official high school transcript and Gannon University Student Transcript Request Form, including guidance counselor recommendation (pages 7-8)
- Official SAT or ACT score report; scores reported on a high school transcript are also acceptable
- Official college transcripts for courses taken while in high school
- Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) regardless of family income level in order to be considered for every available resource.
